| ___ 7. 1881/1885. First major English revision since KJV, based on older manuscripts. | G. King James Version (KJV or AV). |
| ___ 8. 1901. First English translation produced in the United States of America. | H. New International Version (NIV). |
| ___ 9. 1946/1952. American revision of the ASV. | I. New King James Version (NKJV). |
| ___ 10. 1978. "Thought for thought" translation in modern English. | J. Revised Standard Version (RSV). |
| ___ 11. 1982. Literal translation in modern English patterned after | K. Revised Version (RV). |
| ___ 12. 2001. "Essentially literal" translation based on the earlier RSV. | L. Rheims-Douay (or Douay-Rheims) Version. |
